

Increased Responsibility

At CGHS:

- Off campus opportunities
 - Lunch
 - Internships
- Driving / parking

What Parents Can Do: Support student expectations, Help your student show that responsibility of their time

Increased Responsibility

At CGHS:

- Academically focused and increased rigor
- All students are in AP English and Composition
- Increased opportunity for AP classes and college level instruction

What Parents Can Do: Check your students progress report and check in with them. Celebrate where you can and ask them what needs to be done to improve.

Off-Campus Lunch

- Students recently earned the privilege of getting Off-Campus Lunch through working on having a good start for their classes (silent by second bell, finishing the "Do Now" or warm-up entry activity)
- You probably received a permission from them to sign. From turning this in, they received an
 off-campus lunch pass.
- However, they REALLY need to be responsible for returning to 4th period on time
 - 1 time late: Refocus after school. Robocall sent home.
 - 2nd time late: No off-campus lunch for next day. Robocall sent home.
 - o **3rd time:** No lunch for next week (5 days). Advisor calls home.
 - 4th+ time: No lunch for next week (5 days) <u>AND</u> parent meeting with parents, students, advisor + dean to discuss how attendance affects academics and attendance for school events. Dean calls to set-up meeting.
- Also, this privilege can always be taken away as a Junior Class
- PARENTS: Please encourage your student to be responsible with this privilege! Hold them accountable if making poor choices.

Internships

- Our goal is that all students have the opportunity for professional learning experiences during their time at CGHS.
- All students take one trimester of Internship Class in their junior year in place of their elective course.

Internship has two main components:

- 1. **Academic internship** in real-world job settings
- 2. In-class curriculum on professional development:
 - → High quality resume
 - → Mock interviews
 - → Career & College Major research

College Rep and Career Visits

- College Rep visits happen multiple times every week!
 - Admissions counselors from colleges all over Colorado and the country come to present to 11th & 12th grade registrants
 - Students ask questions and receive info about the the college-going process and specific highlights for each school
- Career visits happen every month!
 - Professionals in our community come to speak about their area of employment and tips for pursuing studies and jobs in that industry
 - Areas cover healthcare, engineering, journalism, trade skills (i.e. welding), and more

General Application Process



<u>Junior Year is HIGHLY</u> <u>important</u>

- Academic Profile is stamped and finalized after this year
- This is the year to dive into extracurriculars and show <u>leadership</u> where you can!
- Be an active student in class- teachers need to know students for Letters of Recommendation.

Academic Profile - GPA

GPA: Grade Point Average

- Cumulative GPA is is the average of all the students grades from 9th grade through 11th grade for the college application
- Yes, grades and the classes students take senior year DO still matter

Parents:

- Check the progress reports that come from your student's Advisor!
- Support your student focusing on classwork and grades.
- Transcript and grades can also be found in Infinite Campus.

Academic Profile - PSAT & SAT

- Juniors recently took a practice PSAT these scores help gauge college readiness
 - (Junior College Ready is 1010)
- Students will review scores next week in Advisory

SAT: Scholastic Aptitude Test

- Test administration in April, here at CGHS
- We will support students in retaking the SAT/register for ACT if they would like, but do not plan to administer additional tests on our campus beyond this one.

Academic Profile - PSAT & SAT

Test Optional Schools - Value of the SAT

- The past few years (and this year) many schools are test optional.
- Several schools are also returned to requiring SAT in applications as well as requiring it to determine Scholarships
- There is no true way to know right now if a student will or will not submit the SAT - Doing well matters!










General Application Process

Student Narrative

- Personal Statement will be written in AP Language at the end of the year!
- Relationships with teachers
- Be a strong and engaged student!
 - Ask questions
 - Participate
 - Come to MT

How do we pay for college?



Financial Awareness

Need-based Aid:

\$\$ that your student qualifies for based on your family's household income

Grants
Work Study
Loans

Merit-Based Aid

\$\$ that your student qualifies for based on anything other than income, including GPA, SAT/ACT scores, community services, leadership, etc.

> Scholarships Grants

Financial Awareness

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid FAFSA
- FAFSA is the way that schools understand how much need-based aid your student qualifies for as well as determining additional aid they will offer.

Timeline:

- FAFSA predictor in Junior 1:1 meetings (this Spring)
- September 2023 create Federal Student Aid ID
- October 1 FAFSA opens
- Complete FAFSA Select schools to send it to
- ACT: Be sure that you file your 2022 taxes




